TEEN DISTRACTED DRIVING INITIATIVE



The Livingston County Sheriff's Office in conjunction with FT Techno of America and State Farm Insurance Agent Katie Pikkarainen of Fowlerville are pleased to announce a hands-on distracted driving course for area high school students. This class will be provided to area students and their parents **FREE** of charge.

Parents are encouraged to choose between the 8:30 a.m. or the 1 p.m. class on Saturday October 20th, 2018. Each session will run for approximately four hours in Fowlerville at FT Techno of America.

The teens will be provided with a short classroom discussion and video presentation before spending several hours of supervised driving on the test track at FT Techno.

This course will allow teens to operate a vehicle under direct supervision from Sheriff's Deputies in several distracted driving scenarios. The scenarios will include texting while driving and use of the "fatal vision" drunk driving goggles.

Motor vehicle crashes continue to be the leading cause of injury / death for teens in our country. This course has been designed to teach young driver's first-hand the dangers of distracted driving.

Class size will be limited to twenty students and a parent per class. Attendees are required to possess a valid driver's license and be enrolled in high school. Preference will be given to county resident's first.
