## **ADVISORY BOIL WATER NOTICE**

Loss of pressure in Livingston Community Water Authority System

### **BOIL YOUR WATER BEFORE USING**

**Bring tap water to a rolling boil, boil for one minute, and cool before using** or use bottled water. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking, making ice, washing dishes, brushing teeth, and preparing food until further notice.

This Boil Water Notice applies to Saxony, Wilmor & Meadows Subdivisions. North of Lee Road between Rickett Road east to Whitmore Lake Road.

At about 8:00 am on October 21, 2019 the water system lost pressure due to repairs to 4 – 5 water main valves, replacement of one fire hydrant and a small corporation stop leak. The water will be turned back on the evening of the 21<sup>st</sup> and again the water will be turned off Tuesday October 22, 2019 for replacement of valves not accomplished on Monday. Finish up work will happen on Wednesday the 23<sup>rd</sup> but at this time it is not anticipated that the water will have to be shut down.

When water mains lose pressure, it increases the chance that untreated water and harmful microbes can enter your water.

*Harmful microbes in drinking water can cause diarrhea, cramps, nausea, headaches, or other symptoms and may pose a special health risk for infants, some elderly, and people with severely compromised immune systems. But these symptoms are not just caused by microbes in drinking water. If you experience any of these symptoms and they persist, you should seek medical advice.
